- Investigation of all diseases, injuries, near misses and accidents formulate appropriate preventive action.
- Regularly monitor and review the implementation of and compliance with OH & S policies

- Safe equipment and working procedures including, adequate ventilation, appropriate uniform, safe electrical connections, appropriate resources, clear passageways, etc.
- Good facilities for the welfare of workers such as ergonomically sound furniture, kitchen and dining area, washrooms, first aid kit.
